

Call for Applications: Affilia Editor(s)-in-Chief

Affilia: Journal of Women and Social Work invites applications for editor(s)-in-chief (EIC). Affilia is a peer-reviewed platform dedicated to feminist social work scholarship that is carefully conceptualized, executed, and articulated. As the foremost English-language feminist social work journal, Affilia – and its EIC – plays a crucial role in generating knowledge, evidence, and recommendations for policy and practice that advance social justice.

EIC's charge:

- To develop and lead a plan to raise the profile of *Affilia* and to spotlight the importance of feminist social work scholarship;
- To ensure that work published in the journal meets and even raises the intellectual and methodological standards of scholarship, while also representing the diversity of theories, designs, and goals that characterize feminist social work;
- To maintain Affilia's openness to new questions, theories, and methodologies;
- To expand Affilia's pool of readers, authors, and reviewers; and
- To collaborate effectively with various *Affilia* stakeholders, including the journal's editorial board, consulting board, corporate board, and current publisher (Sage).

EIC position details:

- A prior record of publishing with or reviewing for *Affilia* is not required. However, the EIC must demonstrate a long-standing commitment to feminist social work scholarship in some capacity.
- The four-year term officially begins December 15, 2020, but the incoming EIC will start working with the current EIC team in May 2020 to ensure a smooth transition.
- Financial support for editorial assistance is available.
- Affilia has thrived under diverse leadership structures in the past, including: the traditional model of a single EIC; two EICs with discrete but complementary responsibilities; and the current model of a collaborative triad. We are open to a variety of EIC arrangements. Our top priority is finding an EIC (individual or team) that will help Affilia and feminist social work flourish.
