#### Training HPPAE Students in Health Care Settings: Looking Back and Moving Forward

The Affordable Care Act emphasizes the need for effective and efficient health care for frequent users such as dual eligibles, individuals with chronic illnesses, and older adults. Current research confirms that social work interventions can significantly reduce use of health care services and associated costs while also improving quality of life for older adults. This panel session will explore how educators are preparing Hartford Partnership Program in Aging Education (HPPAE) students to work in these changing health care settings. Panelists include moderator Victoria Rizzo (Binghamton University), and presenters Robyn Golden (Rush University Medical Center), Paul Gould (Binghamton University), and Marilyn Luptak (University of Utah).

### Person-Centered and Participant-Directed Competencies

Social work graduates need person-centered and participant-directed (PC/PD) competencies to work in community-based services for older adults and persons with disabilities. A preconference Faculty Development Institute (FDI) and a Gero-Ed Track panel session will present the PC/PD philosophy and demonstrate strategies to infuse PC/PD competencies and content, beginning with generalist curriculum.
