Successful Aging	Rowe & Kahn (1998)	Avoiding disease; Engagement with life; Maintaining cognitive & physical function	Foundation upon which the Active Aging framework & the Alberta Rose Model were developed
Healthy Aging	Centers for Disease Control (2008)	Development & maintenance of physical, mental and social abilities of older adults	Focus is on communities that take action to prevent/reduce the impact of disease on older adults
Active Aging	World Health Organization (2002)	Participation in life; Meaning of family & the community; Health promotion & activities to promote healthy aging	Identifies conditions necessary for health promotion, such as peace, shelter, food, income, & stable ecosystem
Alberta Rose Model	KPMG Consulting (2002)	Promoting health and preventing disease & injury; Optimizing mental & physical function; Managing chronic conditions; Engaging with life	Builds upon the Successful Aging framework (Rowe & Kahn, 1998)
